General updates and info Attendance

As you are aware we have a school attendance target of 85% which is in line with other SEN schools nationally with Lower school at least 5% higher than this. We want all pupils to be in school every day so they don't miss out on learning and the experiences which matter. You may remember we have already shared the government's strapline 'Moments matter, attendance counts.'

parents/carers in termly data snapshots and over time we will work with families where attendance is not meeting our expectations so we can support and work through any concerns, together.

Reading

'Reading is to the mind what exercise is to the body.'

You can support your child with their education by encouraging them to read.

We are trying to increase the volume of reading materials we have to offer to our pupils and ensure we read to pupils daily as part of a healthy routine. If you have any books which you no longer need and would like to donate to Woodfield, please do drop them off to us. We are also looking to introduce a phonics programme so this can be delivered and followed by all staff through a consistent approach; it is likely to be Bug Club. We'll be in touch when we have firmer details so that you can support your child at home too.

Supporting your child to be equipped for school

Please ensure your child is equipped everyday by sending them with:

• A water bottle (especially as it starts to get warmer, so our pupils stay hydrated, and for when we go to the gym each week)

• A suitable coat for blustery showers

• Comfortable clothing: we expect our pupils to be dressed appropriately for school so they can learn. Currently they should have black trouser bottoms, a white polo t-shirt/shirt and a black jumper. We will communicate with you about updates for September as we would like to introduce some logoed items so pupils can feel they belong to the Woodfield family

• Wellington boots for days when we visit Brolay Farm-Upper school this term

• A swimming kit and a towel for days when we go swimming

• Any medication needed (please ensure you have communicated this with us)

• Lunch if they bring their own
