Focus on Cherry Class

There are currently 6 pupils in Cherry class, all boys. The class is led by Mrs Tanya Gillot who started at Woodfield in April 2024. Their teaching assistant is Ms Victoria Connick who joined us in August. Like Conker Tree, the class follows a structured timetable with two lessons before break and two afterwards, then lunch and two more lessons. Pupils have responsibilities in the classroom for marking themselves present, setting the correct date and recording ASK points, as well as keeping the classroom clean, neat and tidy. Currently the classroom is adorned with pupil 3D craft work, preparing for Christmas. Each pupil has a pencil case in which they collect counters during the day to show their positive engagement and allow them a choice over activities towards the end of the day. Pupils are following the National Curriculum with a strong focus on embedding the key skills of reading, spelling and numeracy. Mrs Gillot is also using Bug Club phonics and Jigsaw for PSHE. This half term, pupils have been learning about being healthy and what being safe means.

When tasks are complete, the boys can choose what they would like to do in their regulation time; they have loved having access to laptops to explore the coding programme Scratch. Mrs Gillot loves sport activities, so in PE lessons and over lunchtimes, the class are often running around playing tag.




Effective communication is important to us -
