Focus on Conker Class

There are currently 4 pupils in Conker class, all boys. The class is led by Mrs Julia Higgins who started at Woodfield in August 2024. Their teaching assistant is Ms Megan Rigby.

The class follows a structured timetable with two lessons before break and two afterwards, then lunch and two more lessons. When pupils arrive, they explore the world around them by watching Newsround. The morning focuses on English, Maths and Science to ensure full concentration and engagement with core skills. We are using Bug Club to continue to develop pupils' phonics knowledge as this will allow them to be even more confident in reading and deciphering new words. For Maths, we are using White Rose Maths. The boys love multiplication and division. At 10.30-10.45am, it's break, where pupils have access to outside with some sports equipment and scooters, as well as a chance to have a bite to eat and a drink: the boys generally have fruit and a slice of toast.

Mrs Higgins likes craft activities, so after break on Mondays, she has organised some amazing activities for pupils to develop their inner design skills. We've seen some fantastic dragon's eyes and line drawings. The boys are becoming budding engineers too, especially in designing their marble run.





Attendance and Safeguarding

Thank you to Charlotte Davis from Leicestershire Local Authority for completing our safeguarding review in October. Her report shares that Woodfield has 'a culture of safeguarding with lots of new initiatives which are beginning to be embedded'. 'Students appeared happy at the school and knew they could speak to a member of staff if they had a concern.'

We monitor attendance at a pupil and whole school level, taking into account, pupils who may follow a reduced timetable to support their needs.
