Focus on PSHE/ RSHE

After Easter we will be teaching the RSHE/RHE module of the PSHE Curriculum to all our pupils. You should have already received a letter detailing our delivery of this important and sensitive part of the PSHE curriculum.

Relationship and Health Education (RHE) for Orange and Cherry Tree classes focuses on health, families, conception and birth. In Conker Tree and Upper School, we follow the Relationships, Sex and Health (RSHE) element of the PSHE curriculum. This will include topics such as different types of families, online safety, contraception, babies, birth, sexually transmitted diseases, body image, sexuality and social media.

During these lessons pupils will be able to ask questions, which will be answered factually in an age and stage appropriate and sensitive manner. Each pupil's privacy will be respected, and no one will be asked to reveal personal information.

Attendance Matters

Our tracking on attendance currently stands at 86%
The visit from Leicestershire Local authority earlier this month to review our attendance policy and procedures was really insightful. Feedback was very positive in terms of our processes.
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There are a few areas which we have drawn on to make further improvements:

-Pupils arriving after the register has closed, unless there is a justifiable reason will be coded as unauthorised absence. We have written to all taxi drivers to remind them that school starts at 8.45am and they must support us by making every effort to get pupils to school on time. We ask for your support in making sure your child is ready and waiting to be collected so no other child is unfairly disadvantaged.

Our pupils in particular work best when there is a clear routine and they know what to expect; arriving late, after a class has started adds to stress and anxiety.

If you have a planned absence for which you are requesting permission, please call the school or email the principal at principal@henrydavidlearning.co.uk We follow government guidance on carefully considering requests for absence, and holidays during term time are unlikely to be authorised.
